Site selection analysis

Tiendanimal, an international pet retailer, has recently opened its 30th store in Montijo, Portugal, underlining the brand's **sustained growth** and confidence in the Portuguese pet retail market.

This study identifies **high-potential locations** for future Tiendanimal stores by prioritizing parishes with **high population density**, **limited direct competition**, and the presence of **shopping centers** or established retail clusters aligned with the brand's preferred store format and visibility requirements.




Massamá e Monte Abraão

União das Freguesias de Massamá e Monte Abraão is a civil parish in the Sintra municipality within the Lisbon metropolitan area, with competitors tightly packed near shopping centers.

With competitors concentrated on one side of the parish, there is an opportunity in underserved zones, supported by local shopping centers and strong daily footfall.




União das freguesias de Oliveira




Póvoa de Santo Adrião e Olival Basto
